THE MAY 20TH SOCIETY ANNOUNCES ANNUAL MECDEC CELEBRATION

Celebratory Preparations Begin for the 234th Anniversary of the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence

Charlotte, N.C. – The May 20th Society, a Charlotte-based, non-profit organization that captures and celebrates the city's rebellious past and visionary future, announces its 2009 historical celebration honoring the 234th anniversary of the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence. It was on May 20, 1775 that Mecklenburg became the first American colony to declare independence from Great Britain.

Kicking off the 2009 celebration will be the annual Captain Jack's Commemorative Bike Ride on Saturday, April 11 at 9:00am.

Then on Wednesday, May 20, a noon observance of the MecDec will take place at Trade and Tryon streets in Charlotte. This event is free and open to the public. That evening, The May 20th Society will culminate the historical celebration with its fourth annual Evening Speaker Series featuring acclaimed historian and author, Doris Kearns Goodwin at the McGlohon Theatre.

"Doris' zeal for American history and literary focuses are truly inspiring," said Charles R. Jonas, III, board chairman of The May 20th Society. "We are thrilled to have her speak in our community to our schoolchildren and speaker series attendees as the core component of our celebration."

Goodwin is the author of the award-winning *Team of Rivals: The Political Genius of Abraham Lincoln* which Barak Obama has repeatedly been seen reading and called "a wonderful book". The New York Times bestseller illuminates Lincoln's political genius, his mastery of men and how it shaped the most significant presidency in the nation's history. A Pulitzer Prize recipient, Goodwin also serves as an NBC-TV news analyst.

After Goodwin's presentation, the floor will be opened to a Q&A session. Tickets to the fourth-annual speaker series are available for \$35. Seating is based on a first-come basis. To purchase tickets, visit May20thSociety.org, CarolinaTIX.org or call 704.372.1000 to purchase them by phone.

Charlotte's May 20th MecDec Celebration dates back to the 1820s, and has been attended by four sitting U.S. presidents including William H. Taft in 1909, Woodrow Wilson in 1916, Dwight Eisenhower in 1954 and Gerald Ford in 1975.

Doris Kearns Goodwin

May 20th, 2009

The May 20th Society proudly presents Doris Kearns Goodwin. Kearns Goodwin, a multiple award-winning author will speak at the May 20th Society Fourth Annual Lecture Series event on the evening of May 20th at The McGlohan Theater and our CMS student history lecture and discussion.

Doris Kearns Goodwin, world-renowned historian, is the author of several books, commentator for NBC, and a consultant and on-air person for PBS documentaries on Lyndon B. Johnson, the

Kennedy Family, Franklin Roosevelt, and Ken Burns' *The History of Baseball.* She was the first female journalist to enter the Red Sox locker room. She received her Ph.D. in Government from Harvard University, where she taught Government including a course on the American Presidency. Following her tenure at Harvard, Mrs. Goodwin served as an assistant to Lyndon Johnson in his last year in the White House. She later assisted Johnson in the preparation of his memoirs.

She is the author of *Lyndon Johnson & The American Dream*, which became a *New York Times* best seller. She followed up in 1987 with the political biography, *The Fitzgeralds and the Kennedys*, which stayed on the *New York Times* Best-Seller List for five months. In 1990, it was made into a six-hour ABC miniseries. Her next book, *No Ordinary Time: Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt: The American Home Front During World War II*, was awarded the Pulitzer Prize in April 1995, as well as the Harold Washington Literary Award, the New England Bookseller Association Award, the Ambassador Book Award, and the Washington Monthly Book Award. It was a *New York Times* best seller for six months.

Her most recent work, a monumental history of Abraham Lincoln entitled *Team of Rivals: The Political Genius of Abraham Lincoln*, published in October 2005, joined the best-seller lists on its first week in publication, and soon reached #1 on the *New York Times* Best-Seller List. *Team of Rivals* won the 2006 Lincoln Prize for an outstanding work about the president and/or the Civil War, the inaugural New York Historical Society Book Prize, the Richard Nelson Current award and the New York State Archives History Makers Award. Steven Spielberg is developing a feature film about the book, set to star Liam Neeson as Lincoln and Sally Field as Mary.











The May 20th Society hosts the annual MecDec noon observance commemoration for the general public on Charlotte's Independence Square.

"Captain Jack" Bike Ride Captures Spirit of MecDec

April 11 Event Commemorates Historic 1775 Ride

Charlotte, N.C. – The May 20th Society, a non-profit group which organizes and funds educational events to celebrate the history of Mecklenburg County, is partnering with Charlotte Health and Fitness (CHF) Magazine, a fitness-focused publication with a readership of thousands of cyclers, for the bike ride to commemorate Charlotte's original rebel, Captain James Jack. The annual event is scheduled for Saturday, April 11.

Captain Jack, a colonial tavern owner, rode more than 1,100 miles on horseback all the way to Philadelphia to deliver the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence (MecDec) to the Second Continental Congress in 1775.

The event will mark the start of The May 20th Society's 2009 MecDec celebration and is expected to draw several hundred cyclists. Beginner and seasoned cyclists alike can ride in 20- and 50-mile routes, while families can enjoy a short five-mile route. The ride will be held on the outskirts of the county in the Waxhaw area to allow for the extended course. Though not considered a race, door prizes will be awarded to participants for various accomplishments.

David Klein, avid cyclist and CHF publisher, says the ride is a great way for participants to get valuable exercise while supporting a worthy Charlotte cause.

"We are honored to be participating again with The May 20th Society for this event," said Klein. "It's very exciting to be a part of our city's great history, and being able to tie it in with our goal of fitness makes it a great partnership that we look forward to continuing for years to come."

Pat Mumford, also a passionate cyclist and former city councilman, chaired the event and will ride in support. "Although we won't be riding all the way to Philadelphia, this is a great way to celebrate a classic happening in Charlotte's history," said Mumford.

The ride will begin at 9:00 am and online registration is available by clicking on the Charlotte Health and Fitness Magazine web site at www.CHFMag.com. The cost for registration is \$20 for adults and children 15-18, and includes marked rest stops, Captain Jack t-shirts, and family-style lunch at the start/finish line.
